BURGLARIES

Law enforcement sees an uptick in property crimes when the weather gets warmer. Crooks can move around more comfortably after the cold season recedes. Some youthful lawbreakers have more time on their hands when school is on a break. The neighborhood crime that our patrol deputies encounter most frequently is the nighttime burglary of parked cars and trucks.

But there are ways to drastically reduce the chance that your vehicle is the next target:

- •Lock your vehicle doors.
- •Park in a well-lit area.
- •When you are not in your vehicle, hide valuables in the trunk or remove them.

The steps listed above cost nothing. You can also invest in prevention. Vehicle alarm systems, driveway gates and easily-noticed residential security cameras can all reduce these common crimes. Also, there are kits that truck owners can buy to make their vehicle tailgates much harder to remove. Many rims and hubcaps can be locked, too.

The steps for preventing burglaries of residences are similar.

- •Keep home doors locked all the time. Use indoor lights to indicate someone is home. Outdoor security lighting, front and back, scares burglars away.
- •Keep trees and bushes trimmed to reduce the number of places burglars can hide.
- •Fences, gates, alarm systems and video cameras deter lawbreakers from coming on your property. Too often, residents have home alarm systems but do not activate them before leaving home.
- •At the rear of residences, windows, patio doors and French doors appeal to thieves as ways to get inside. Use fortified materials and locks to make them harder to open or break.

Don't wait for a burglary to take photos of your possessions and record serial numbers of electronics, bicycles and other products. That way, your belongings may be easier to recover if you do become a break-in victim.
