

Notes From the President

With the changing of the seasons from hot to warm, I've been out in the neighborhood more, and have noticed a lot more foot traffic. Some neighbors I recognize, some I know and many I don't know. With the holidays approaching, please keep an even more watchful eye. If someone or something looks suspicious, call the constable. If it's someone who belongs here-the constable will get to meet them. If they don't belong here then the constable has the opportunity to establish the presence of the patrol in the neighborhood. Hopefully, this makes our neighborhood less of a target.

When reporting to the constable, no matter what the issue, there is a series of detailed questions you must answer. Be patient, speak calmly and give as much detail as possible, so a unit can be dispatched promptly.

Reporting all incidences to the constable is the only way to track crime. We finally have enough data to see some patterns both with timing and particular areas. This helps us to dispatch our resources more effectively.

Constable Patrol benefits the entire community. Encourage your neighbors to join!

When should I call 911, and when should I call the Constable Dispatch?

Residents should always use 911 for any life threatening situations requiring police, fire, or ambulance response, or if there is a crime in progress. A "crime in progress" is something the caller is witnessing at the time, for example, a home is being broken into; someone is being mugged, robbed, beaten, abducted, or there is a major accident with injuries.
